

Partnerships between a EU+ company and supply-chain partners and/or public-benefit partner

An **own contribution** of 50% of project volume (with discounts for SMEs)



Who can apply?

Partnership application consisting of (at least) one or more:

Business Partner(s):

- Private sector company operating in agricultural supply chains
- Registered in EU, EEA, UK or Switzerland
- Financial contribution according to enterprise size (25-100% funding sum)


either Public-Benefit Partner(s)

- Institution/organization/corporation with public-benefit status
- No geographic restrictions
- Potential funding recipient
- and/or Supply-Chain Partner(s):
 - Private sector company within the same supply chain
 - Registered in a DAC-listed country


The DDF supports projects


